Déljñę Got'jñę Government Phase 2 Recovery Travel Directive

This Phase 2 Recovery Travel Directive is enacted as law under the *DGG Covid-19 Recovery Law – Phase 2*, passed by the DGG on April 9, 2020. This Phase 2 Recovery Travel Directive addresses the need to ease the restrictions of the Travel Restriction Directive and the Phase 1 Recovery Travel Directive, passed by the DGG on June 3, 2020 and repealed on June 12, 2020.

GENERAL TRAVEL

1. Travelers on passenger charters will not be allowed to enter the Community of Déljñę without prior approval from the ʔekw'ahtjǰé or his designate.
2. All arriving travelers will be required to review and sign the DGG Self-Declaration form.
3. All service delivery personnel must not interact with people of Déljñę. They are directed to drop off cargo at designated areas and leave immediately.
4. The GNWT allows out-of-territory essential workers to bypass a 14-day self-isolation period when traveling into the NWT with an approved worker self-isolation plan. The DGG may require those essential workers to self-isolate and self-monitor for 14 days in Déljñę to ensure they do not have symptoms of COVID-19. This means that they cannot go outside their lodgings or another secure area or have contact with anyone else (except those they have travelled with) for 14 days.

MEDICAL TRAVEL

(These requirements apply to all Déljñę Residents travelling from and back to the Community of Déljñę for medical appointments and medical care of any kind)

Medical Patients travelling outside of the NWT for medical appointments and treatment:

5. Déljñę residents who are travelling outside the NWT for medical care must follow the CPHO directive. This means they must meet the following requirements:
 - a. They must be in isolation for 14 days at designated isolation sites outside Déljñę; and
 - b. They must be cleared to travel back to Déljñę before they are allowed to re-enter the community.

Medical patients travelling within NWT for appointments and treatment:

6. All Déljné Patients and escorts must comply with the Health Practices that have been outlined by the NWT Chief Medical Officer for travel and must comply with Déljné's directives.

COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT

7. Violating the terms of this directive could lead to the following penalties:
 - a. Banishment from Déljné until such time as determined by the Déljné Got'jné Government; and
 - b. Any other measure which the DGG deems appropriate.

The terms of this Directive may be updated in the near future. The DGG will continue to actively assert its authority to issue further directives and pass any necessary emergency legislation in order to protect the health of Déljné residents with steps to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 virus.
